The overhead crane has been made to be used doing repetitive lifting activities. This type of crane could be utilized in many capacities. They may be utilized for specialized lifting tasks like installing or removing major plant equipment.

In order to safely use an overhead crane, staff should employ safe rigging practices. This needs both knowledge and practice. The load must be rigged right in order to ensure its stability when raised. Prior to beginning a hoisting task, it should be determined that the crane is suitable for the task, with appropriate lift, capacity and travel. The crane must be subjected to a thorough physical and visual check before utilization. The capacity of all machines, including the slings, hardware and rope, must never exceed load weight capacities.

Before using the rigger has to know what sling is right for each and every lift and must check the rigging hardware and gear. The communications which are utilized with the crane operator need to be concise and clear. A signaler must be designated for the role and signals should be agreed upon. The crane operator has to follow directions from the designated individual only. If a wired or remote controller is being utilized, the operator should be trained in all its functions.

Prior to any lifting starts, the path of the load should be cleared of all obstructions and a warning sign should be issued to guarantee the safety of the workers. Pedestrian are not under any circumstance allowed to walk underneath the lift loads. The crane hoist should be centered over the load prior to lifting to prevent swinging. The safety catch must be closed immediately after sliding the sling entirely onto the lifting hook. Unused sling legs must be secured so they do not drag. Never leave loose materials on a load being lifted. Watch that hands and fingers are clear when slack is taken out of a sling. Step clear of the danger zone before the lift is carried out.
